COMMUNITY MEDICAL CENTERS (CMP) - Mohammed V Foundation for Solidarity

1 020 has seen considerable progress through the implementation of the program of CMP - Mohammed V Foundation for Solidarity. Upon Royal Instructions, three new units have been programmed in Fez, Tangier and Casablanca. A unit has been completed in the new city of Errahma and a project is currently under study to equip the city of Marrakech with a CMP - Mohammed V Foundation for Solidarity.

To date, a total of 12 units will cover the national territory. This is an ambitious program that aims to set up an intermediate network of semi-hospital structures offering a complete range

of specialized care that is more accessible to disadvantaged populations. Indeed, located in a high-density agglomeration far from hospital centers, a CMP - Mohammed V Foundation for Solidarity provides an integrated circuit of care. It includes emergencies, consultation and care services for chronic diseases, radiology and biology services, a maternity center and a day hospital. This platform, implemented in 2016 in partnership with the Ministry of Health as well as the regional and prefectural councils of the implementing regions, will cover the cities of Casablanca, Madinat Errahma, Rabat, Temara, Salé, Marrakech, Tangier, Fez and Agadir.

HOME FOR THE ELDERLY - SIDI ALLAL BAHRAOU

nce its implementation in 2018, this project represents a support for the initiative spearheaded by the Muslim Association of Beneficence and Social Mutual Aid that acts with the homeless in Sidi Allal Bahraoui. The region, known for its agricultural activity and the seasonal employment of a workforce from other provinces, is experiencing a phenomenon of wandering elderly people. In 2015, a first experience of accommodation and solidarity meals was implemented by the association, but it only offered a temporary and limited help. Faced with the need to adopt a more structured and sustainable solution, the Foundation launched in 2018 the Home for the Elderly project, with a capacity to accommodate 52 people. First of its kind in this region, the center is a social institution that opened its doors in April 2020 in the Ahouaz Jnane Maamoura neighborhood, despite the context of total

confinement, welcoming 48 residents from Sidi Allal Bahraoui but also from other cities of the Kingdom (Kenitra, Rabat, Casablanca, Khémisset, Berkane, Agadir, Al Hoceima, ...). Aged between 65 and 94, marginalized and mostly without family, the residents have found refuge in the centers which offers them a room and comprehensive care including accommodation, food, nursing, animation and support for socioprofessional reintegration. In order to stimulate autonomy and social ties, the residents are encouraged to practice manual activities, such as drawing, wicker weaving or market gardening in the farmhouse set up for this purpose. They also benefit from a daily medical supervision (care and rehabilitation) provided by a team of a senior nurse and three assistants.

The house is managed by the Bahraoui Muslim Association of Beneficence and Social Mutual Aid.

These shelters will offer the same social services of accommodation, food, animation and medical care, and

provide residents with commercial spaces to encourage their social reintegration and promote their financial autonomy. In addition, they will provide an ambulatory assistance and care service that will be deployed in the surrounding neighborhoods. These three projects are planned to be completed in 12 months.

DIGITAL SOLIDARITY CENTER SOLICOD - TANGIER

irst experience launched by the Foundation in the field of digital inclusion, the Solicod Digital Center, whose design was inspired by the OCP Group 1337 Coding School model, aims to support new needs in digital skills by promoting the emergence of potential profiles among disadvantaged youth. The center will allow young people to follow a qualifying and certifying training ("Simplon" Certificate) in web development and web applications.

The center is open, without any academic prerequisite, to young people aged between 18 and 35. The course lasts for 9 to 11 months of learning declined on 1170 hours of training, including 110 hours of internship. It is based on the Unicode model as well as on the active pedagogy and the sharing of



knowledge. Indeed, the learners, who can manage some of the courses among themselves, follow their training on the French online platform Simplon and are supervised by a Simplon certified pedagogical representative.

Given the context of the pandemic, the center, which opened its doors in December 2020, has a small enrollment of 60 young people (including 14 girls) divided into three working groups. Students are from Tangier and other cities in the Kingdom (Tetouan, Khenifra, Laayoune, Dakhla ...). Regarding the management, it's provided by the Office of Vocational Training and Labor Promotion through a dedicated team of supervisors and teachers with specific profiles.

YOUTH VOCATIONAL TRAINING MULTIDISCIPLINARY CENTER - ROMMANI

ommani Youth Vocational Training Multidisciplinary Center is a unique structure in the region. Opened Lin October 2020, it aims to reduce the phenomenon of inactivity among young people, while offering them the opportunity to study without being forced to migrate to other cities such as Kenitra and Khémisset. Young people, with or without a baccalaureate, can access four training courses: sewing, accounting, aluminum and electricity. These trades have been defined according to the needs of the local market, so as to guarantee employment opportunities for the young graduates.

Youth Vocational Training

The center also offers a curriculum of technical classes for young college students, who attend training workshops alternating face-to-face and distance learning.

For the start of the 2020 - 2021 school year, the center has welcomed 85 trainees divided between the various courses of studv.

The center also has a space dedicated to pre-school education which will soon open its doors to children aged between 3 and 6 years.

n 2020, the Foundation began a thorough dematerialization of its project management procedures (610 physical projects in addition to humanitarian programs and trainings). It has implemented a new governance model to govern its relationships with all its entities. This system, which takes the form of a central project management system, facilitates the steering of projects and the management of the Foundation's entire portfolio.

The objective of this new information system is to coordinate the management of the Foundation's projects and to reposition the central project office with respect to the decentralized entities (regional project managers) for the planning, prioritization and execution of programs, activities and projects. More specifically, this new system aims to progressively increase the level of efficiency in terms of management through:

- control of project management (forward planning, deadlines, costs, etc.);
- the implementation of mechanisms and tools necessary for a rigorous and efficient 0 management of the whole project portfolio;
- continuous optimization of project execution (improvement of skill levels, 0 optimization of investments, better budget control, etc.);
- and the guarantee of operational efficiency (management of document repositories, resource management, standardization of practices, industrialization of reporting, etc.).

The implementation of this system offers a perfect balance between tactics and strategy. It seamlessly manages the Foundation's entire project portfolio and skillfully controls internal assets to optimize their impact.

The system was designed and developed entirely by the Foundation's internal resources. It will be operational in early 2021.



THE FOUNDATION'S NEW WEB PORTAL GOES LIVE

he Foundation's new website went live in December 2020. This project is based on the development of a new modern and dynamic digital showcase. It capitalizes on the history of the Foundation, its expertise, and gives a better visibility to its projects as well as to the commitment of its partners.

With a completely redesigned architecture, the new site offers a better reading of the fundamental components of the Foundation and its actions. It highlights its projects and programs through new, thematic and educational content (infographics, diagrams, key figures, etc.). Organized around five main sections, the content puts into perspective the richness and diversity of the interventions carried out in favor of the inclusion of vulnerable and disadvantaged populations. The search for information is more fluid, and the new site has become an ergonomic and user-friendly space.

New spaces have been created: a media section for the press, a community space dedicated to associations, the Foundation's relay partners and a YouTube channel.

With a dynamic and modern design, the site gives a large place to the image and is at the service of the contents. With its responsive design, the site adapts to all screens and responds to the new uses of social media. It includes a YouTube channel that gives access to all the communication campaigns related to the National Solidarity Campaign and Operation Marhaba, as well as to video content related to the Foundation's actions.

espite the pandemic imposed conditions, the Foundation continued its work in favor of the economic inclusion of disadvantaged youth and rural women. Activities created between 2018 and 2019 under the Integration through Economic Activity Program (PIAE), which is in its fourth year of implementation, have admittedly slowed down. But in 2020, the identification and validation of 682 new initiatives indicate that efforts have been maintained to provide remote support and identify new project holders.

Combined with the positive socio-economic impact of the Solidarity Market of L'Oasis, the experience of the PIAE - particularly with regard to cooperative projects has paved the way for the initiation of a new integrated support mechanism dedicated to cooperatives. 2020 was thus marked by the launch of the Cooperative Support and Accompaniment Program (PAAC), whose areas of intervention cover issues related to organization, skills, production, financing and market access. Carried out in

partnership with social and solidarity economy actors as well as the Regions, this program has focused, for its first year of activity, on agricultural (local products) and artisanal production cooperatives.

In the context of the 2020 pandemic, changes were made in the PIAE's targeting in order to strengthen solidarity mobilization. More concretely, the Foundation has increased PIAE beneficiaries (individual projects) to include a significant number of disadvantaged youth (205 income-generating activity project holders) directly impacted by the crisis, and has limited targeting to cooperatives that operate in the service sector.

These changes reflect the Foundation's desire to optimally structure its action vectors by adapting them to the crisis context and to specific support needs. In addition, and thanks to the national program «Intilaka» launched in February 2020 upon Royal Directives, new perspectives of revival and development would consolidate PIAE activities.

2020 MILESTONE REVIEW

In 2020, the first stage of the program's implementation allowed for the selection of cooperatives to receive support, from a group of projects identified directly in the field or proposed by the program's partners.

A diagnosis of the activities current state was carried out, by a firm of experts, through the evaluation of production units and the holding of focus groups with the cooperatives' representatives and members. The diagnosis focused on the following components: regulation and sanitary measures (respect for the environment, legal aspects, organization of general assemblies, sanitary authorizations/accreditations, etc.), production and product development





(processing, product quality, packaging, labeling, etc.), the logistics chain (production and development unit premises, equipment, product transport, etc.), marketing and sales techniques, financial management, governance and internal organization. As a consequence, it was possible to judge the relevance of projects and needs in terms of support and accompaniment. This stage has also served to develop plans for upgrading and development, according to the different areas of intervention defined by the program. These plans, submitted to the Foundation for approval, will be implemented starting in 2021.

n 2020, restrictions on travel and contacts limited At the same time, and upon instructions of His Maiesty the Foundation's outreach activities, particularly the medical campaign program which was suspended in March. Nevertheless, given the direct impact of the pandemic on vulnerable populations and the need to provide support to as many people as possible, the Ramadan food distribution operation was maintained. It has been implemented according to a modus operandi adapted to a strict security protocol. The same goes for the operation to welcome Moroccans living abroad, which was activated as soon as the borders were opened 2020. in July.

King Mohammed VI, may God assist Him, the Foundation was involved in the fight against the pandemic effects. It has coordinated in-kind donations generated by citizen solidarity, in favor of social welfare institutions and regional public health structures.

And to prove that solidarity is not only a matter of national concern, the Foundation supported, through the Moroccan mobilization, the population of the city of Beirut affected by the explosions that occurred in August

MOBILIZING SOLIDARITY TO FIGHT AGAINST COVID-19

ince the inception of measures to combat the spread of Covid-19, the Foundation made an initial commitment by donating ten million dirhams to the special fund dedicated to managing the pandemic, created by His Majesty King Mohammed VI, may God assist Him.

The national solidarity drive initiated by the Sovereign was marked by a strong mobilization of Moroccan citizens and national institutions. Numerous in-kind donations (food products, hygiene products, medicines and protective masks, equipment...) were made to the Foundation in order to strengthen the means of fighting the disease and to guarantee direct aid to vulnerable populations. The Foundation has organized a chain of solidarity that has benefited various social welfare institutions, including orphanages and homes for the elderly throughout the kingdom. Some donations, consisting of medical equipment (i.e. respirators for intensive care units) and ambulances, were given to regional hospitals and to the Ministry of Health.

"RAMADAN 1441" FOOD DISTRIBUTION OPERATION

nitiated by His Majesty King Mohammed VI, may God assist Him, the Foundation organized the 21st edition of the Ramadan food distribution operation, thus participating in the national fight against the effects of Covid-19.

Given this unprecedented context and in accordance with the directives of His Majesty King Mohammed VI, may God assist Him, the Foundation has strengthened its means in order to widen the coverage of the households benefiting from food support. The total number of beneficiaries has been extended to 600,000 households (i.e. 100,000 additional households compared to the previous edition), for a total investment of 85 million dirhams (purchase of foodstuffs and logistics). The increase in the number

of beneficiary households concerned all the provinces of the Kingdom, and was applied according to criteria related to the size of the population, the area of residence (rural/urban) and the level of poverty and vulnerability. Three million people have benefited from food distribution.

This year, the distribution was carried out in compliance with health and protection guidelines, according to the protocol and procedures adapted by the local authorities. It was provided by the "caïdats" in the framework of local committees monitoring the operation. The latter were responsible for informing the heads of families about the new procedures in advance, and for organizing the food distribution directly to households, door-to-door.

EXCEPTIONAL EDITION OF MARHABA OPERATION TO WELCOME MOROCCANS LIVING ABROAD

ince July 2020, the gradual lifting of national restrictions, taken against the pandemic, has made ♥ international travel possible, especially between Morocco and host countries of Moroccan community living in Europe (except Spain).

As soon as the national borders were exceptionally opened to allow the return of Moroccans living abroad by air and their transit by sea from France and Italy, His Majesty King Mohammed VI, may God assist Him, gave His High Instructions to implement special Marhaba reception arrangements for the community members.

The Foundation has reactivated its reception areas in Morocco, France and Italy, providing travelers with social and medical assistance services to deal with any unforeseen event. Due to the reduction in transit points, the Foundation had to adapt its intervention mechanism: 13 of the 20 existing reception areas were activated, and a reduced configuration in terms of human and material resources was applied based on the air and sea transport plans adopted.

The Foundation also ensured that the guidelines for The operation went smoothly, thanks to the synergy combating the spread of Covid-19 (sanitary measures, barrier gestures, sanitization of reception facilities the safety of travelers and dedicated teams. The same applies to the various parties involved in the operation, who have adopted special protocols at transit and crossing points (mandatory PCR and serology test checkpoints, temperature measurement in airports,

COACHES TRAINING - PIAE

his program is a new initiative launched in 2020, it was designed to develop the capacities of VSEs centers' coaches (in Casablanca and Fez) in terms of using virtual and digital tools. It also constitutes an alternative intervention to overcome the constraint of the cessation of activities caused by the pandemic.

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However, the remote accompaniment of the different beneficiary populations of the Center's services was ensured through the deployment of a remote activity program, aiming at promoting the rights of people with disabilities and monitoring persons of concern in different center's technical poles, except for the medical one. Indeed, it was only as from June 23, 2020 that services of consultations and care have been resumed. However, 2020 has allowed the completion of the regional section of Agadir and the starting work (study phase) on two new regional sections in Beni Mellal and Guelmim.

UNITED NATIONS INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT ORGANIZATION (UNIDO): «Support Program for Green Enterprises in Morocco"

With an overall budget of 16.4 million euros financed by the European Union, this initiative aims to achieve productive, circular and sustainable economies, by acting on the consumption and production of goods and services. To date, 17 green and circular business projects have been selected in Morocco, for a funding of 2.5 million dirhams. As a partner of the program since 2019, the CTPES intervenes on the components of assistance for the creation of activities and post-creation support. In 2020, it organized the first training sessions for 24 national coaches who will supervise the identified green business projects.



VSE CREATION PROJECT

Partnership between the Foundation (PIAE) and the Casablanca-Settat Region

Resulting from a partnership between the Foundation and the Casablanca-Settat Regional Council within the framework of the PIAE, this program is based on financial support (in the form of equipment) of 20 million dirhams aimed at creating 452 economic activities (287 IGAs, 145 VSEs and 20 cooperatives) in all the provinces of the region. The CTPES acts as an identification and incubation platform for 40 VSE beneficiaries of the program.



DAR-AL MOUKAWIL ATTIJARI-WAFA BANK PROJECT

Young VSEs in the CTPES program were accompanied by the skills of Dar-Al Moukawil in order to benefit from offered support and financing mechanisms. They were able to attend five information sessions on the program, participate in training and consulting days and hold B2B meetings.



MASTER'S DEGREE IN ENTREPRENEURIAL COACHING

Within the framework of the partnership concluded between CTPES and Hassan II University in 2016, CTPES launched the recruitment of the 5^{th} promotion of the Master's Degree in Entrepreneurial Coaching.

To date, the master has recorded a membership of 110 learners including 25 active coaches.

The National Strategy for Financial Inclusion (SNIF) initiated since 2016 in Morocco aims at reducing disparities in terms of access and use of financial services, as well as accelerating the socio-economic development of the kingdom. Microfinance, through the creation of income-generating activities, is an essential lever that contributes to the economic inclusion of low-income populations.

Skills support program – Training

The CMS has put in place an emergency plan to support, post-Covid-19, the staff and beneficiaries of the Micro-Credit Associations (MCAs). This plan focused on a strategic diagnosis of the impact of the pandemic on Moroccan MCAs, their staff and their beneficiary clients. Two surveys were conducted thanks to the co-funding of the Social Performance Task Force (SPTF) and the provision of the «Survey ValiData» application to the CMS. These surveys provided recommendations as the basis for the 2020 Emergency Action Plan and the 2021 Training Plan. The Training Program was thus entirely reviewed and adapted to the 2020 context. The plans for the 2nd, 3rd and 4th semesters of 2020 have been readjusted and new training channels have been set up.

• The drafting of specifications for a study on the microfinance sector in Morocco and its future in the context of the Covid-19;
